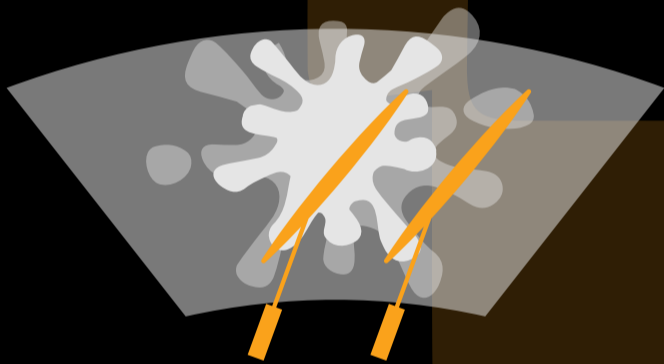


## Understanding Truck Drivers

### RAIN AND SNOW

In slippery conditions with low visibility, **extreme caution is required.**

#### Keep in mind



**Trucks kick up a lot of water along their path,** which creates a spray that impedes visibility as you drive behind them. And if they drive through a puddle, they can splash a huge amount of water onto a car, causing the driver to lose all visibility for a few seconds.

**When it is raining or snowing,** asphalt is more slippery and you need to keep more distance from trucks since they need several more feet to brake and are slower at changing direction.



**On steep downgrades with snow, hail, or mud,** a truck could jackknife if it tries to brake.
